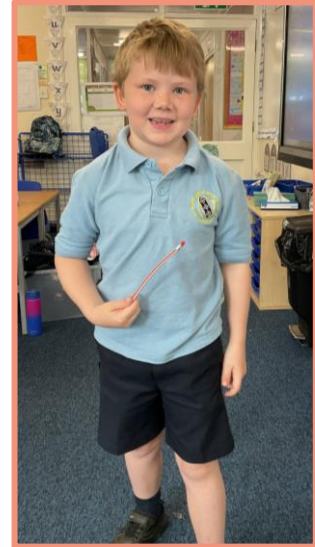
HOCKEY LEAGUE

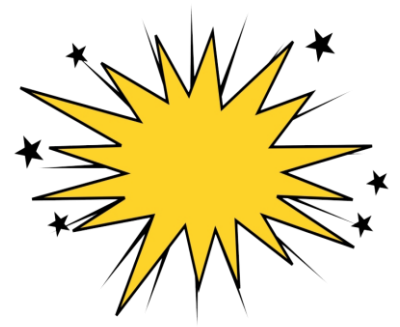
NETBALL

FOREST SCHOOL

Today in forest school we have been tidying up the woodland garden, exploring the parts of nettles and making nettle cordage. We used gardening gloves to take the hairs and leaves off the stems then bashed the stems with hammers to soften them. Once they were soft we could split the stalks and use the fibres to make our cords. We have spread wood chippings to help control the mud on the paths, played games, held the first Britain's got x factor and the mud kitchen catered for a birthday party. It's been a lovely sunny day in the woods.
