




#### **Coppull Library**

#### Heritage Weekend, 2025

Here in Eccleston at St Mary the Virgin, which at over 900 years old is one of the oldest churches in Lancashire, we will be celebrating Heritage Open Days on Saturday, 20th and Sunday, 21st September by opening the church. This is part of the country's largest festival of history and culture. The theme this year is architecture. Volunteers have organised free events, offering access to places and stories that help to bring to life the history of the church and its benefactors. These events include guided tours of the church and a Bat Watch (Saturday night) with Lancashire Wildlife Trust.

The church will be open from 10am on Saturday and after Eucharist on Sunday from 12-30pm. Refreshments will be available in the Parish Hall. There will be activities for children to explore the building with a scavenger hunt and puzzles.
